

CRITERION – I CURRICULAR ASPECTS

1.1 Curriculum Planning and Implementation:-

- The college plans and executes curricular and cocurricular activities. Along with arts and commerce stream, the college run certificate courses for benefit of students. This year Solapur University has approved Research Center in English which was previously approved as research place.
- Contribution of faculty in policy making of University:
 - Dr. N.B. Pawar, the principal of our college is working as the Dean of faculty of Arts and fine arts of Solapur University and playing key-role in designing academic and administrative policy of university.
- Many faculty members of our college have worked as the chairpersons and members of committees drafting syllabit for courses of Solapur University.
- The institutional IQAC monitors execution of plan of curricular and co-curricular activities, analyses feedback from stakeholders, action taken reports submitted by departments and takes corrective measures to sustain and enhance quality of teaching and learning.

1.2 Academic Flexibility:-

- Introduction of CBCS (choice based credit system) by Solapur University from 2016-17.
- The college continued following certificate courses approved by Solapur University:-
 - 1. Spoken English
 - 2. Montessori Teachers Training Course.
 - 3. Tally- 0.96

1.3 Curriculum Enrichment:-

The college has followed below-mentioned measures to supplement curriculum prescribed by the university:

- Introduction of certificate courses
- Organizing preparatory coaching
- Lectures, workshop organized by Career Guidance and Counseling Cell.
- Activities organized by N.S.S. and Cultural Depts.
- Participation of faculty in workshops, conferences.
- Supplying internet connectivity through Network Center, Inflibnet.
- Training through language lab.
- Organized programmes for gender sensitization and raising environmental awareness.
- Organizing Mock interviews, placement Drive. 45 students of college has got placement as sales officer in ICICI Bank.

1.4 Feedback System:-

The college has developed mechanism for seeking feed back from :

Inhouse students, Alumni, Parents, Sports persons (both Alumni/Inhouse students), teaching and non-teaching staff.

- The received feedback is analysed meticulously and suggestions and findings of the same are incorporated in planning and execution of activities throughout the year.
- As post-feedback analysis measure, college has upgraded the following –

- 1. Language lab, Network resource center, library, Gymkhana.
- 2. Napkin vendor and Destroyal machines are made available in ladies rest room.
- Many faculties who worked as Dean, BOS members, Chairmen of syllabus drafting committee etc. have tried to incorporate findings of this feedback analysis in policy designing of Solapur University.
- Apart from routine courses approved by university, the college runs the center of Yashwantrao Chavan Maharashtra Open University, Nashik for benefit of students of the area.
- The college is planning to seek permission and start more career-oriented certificate courses, post-graduate teaching and research centers and proposals of the same are being sent.

- Considerable increase is observed in number of students seeking admission to commerce faculty.

2.2 Catering to Student Diversity

The college paid due attention to students from all sections by providing facilities in campus and by offering financial assistance.

- Preparatory teaching to B.A./B.Com I and certificate courses students was given in beginning of first semester.
- Lectures of and interaction with Mrs. Bhagyashri Bile (Solapur District Sports Officer) and Miss. Poonam Chavan (Stage Artist and Film Actress) our alumni were organized on topic of 'Save the Female Child'.
- Number of campaigns, drives were organized by college for raising the awareness of the staff and students.
- Our cultural department organized programmes on different days with the focus on sensitizing the staff and students regarding issues of gender sensitization and environmental awareness.

2.3 Teaching-Learning Process

- Different departments and working committees prepared and submitted annual plans of teaching and co-curricular activities to IQAC and reviewed, finalized and implemented with required modifications.
- Chairmen and in-charge of committees were given autonomy to use corrective measures while executing the plans and were asked to submit the action taken reports to IQAC.
- The principal, being the chairman of IQAC and the coordinator along with Heads of Department and the Chairmen of working committee took reviews of the teaching-learning process and final results at the regular interval.
- The institutional IQAC is functioning as the apex body, preparing plans of curricular and co-curricular activities and filtering and disseminating to the staff and students.

- The college IQAC, in consultation with LAC (now LMC) and now LMC attempted to arrange for required infrastructural facilities for effective implementation of curricular and co-curricular planning.
- Focused on making teaching students-centric and facilities like LCDs, net- connectivity, inflibnet, language-lab are supplied to both students and staff.
- Academic, psycho-social and career counseling given through interaction with students, organizing the lectures of experts, arranging mock-interviews, tests etc.
- Library resources are upgraded, more titles purchased, periodicals subscribed.
- Required mechanism for monitoring and evaluating quality of teaching-learning is available. The college LAC/LMC monitored outcomes and results of teaching and learning.



 - d) The work of construction of three classrooms and attached room to cabin of the principal is in progress.


- e) The work of renovation and repairs of existing college building has been completed.
